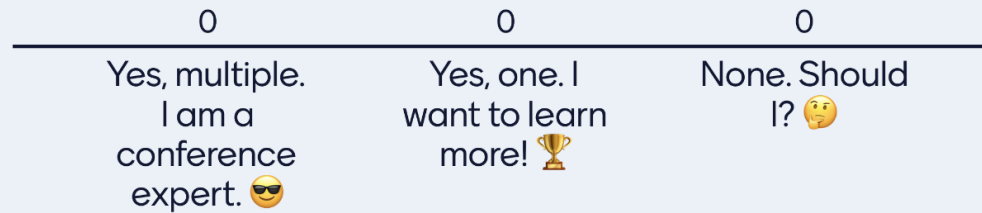

BEFORE

- Registration fees
 - Supervisor
 - Self-payment
 - Funds/ Conference grants
 - Volunteering
- Register for travel abroad
- Secure accommodation and flight
- Investigate location and distances



DURING

- Arriving at the location
 - Organize yourself
 - Consider jet lag
- Ask for and keep all receipts
- Per diem rates may apply



AFTER

- G+PS research dissemination fund, 500\$
- Forestry Research-Based Conference & Research Dissemination Fund, 600\$
- Reconcile expenses (pdf not heic)



Research & Presenting

- Stick to academic standards
- Dry run your presentation
- Design tips
 - Balance text and visuals
 - Keep it simple
 - Create contrast
- Make it engaging
 - Hook
 - Finish with the start
 - Don't stick to a script
 - Practice body language
- How to slay in Q&A
 - Honesty
 - Anticipate questions
 - Take your time
- Handling anxiety
 - Preparation and Equipment
 - Breathing and visualization
 - Perspective
- Take notes
- Have a meeting with your supervisor
 - Debrief
 - Discuss how to continue your research agenda
- Reflect on experiences and incorporate learnings



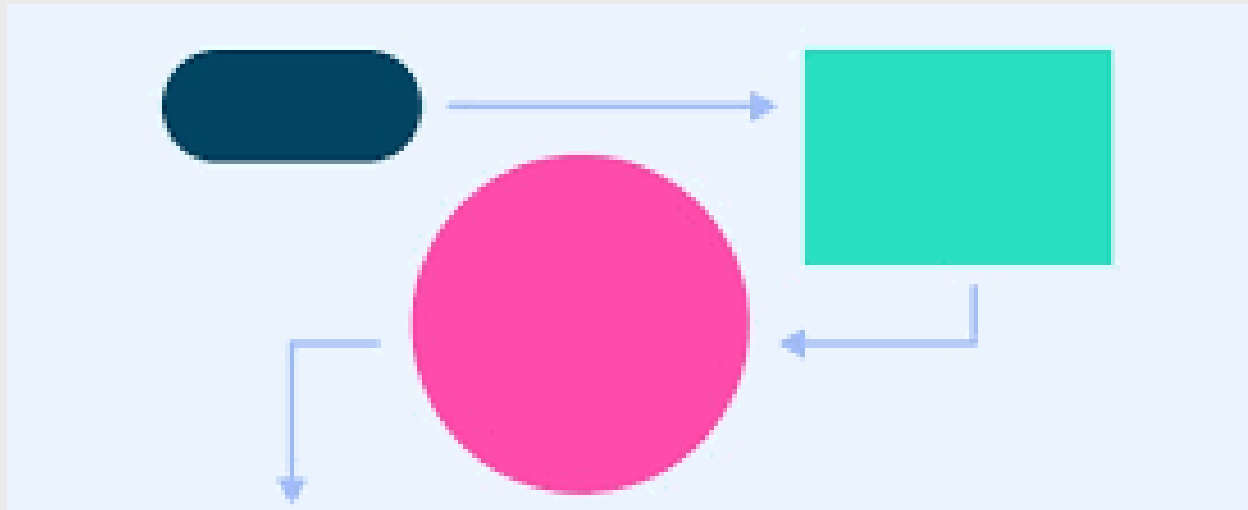
