The suite comprises individual movements, written by a group of international composers, each drawing inspiration from a metal produced in large quantities in their country (e.g. Copper from Chile, Lithium from Australia, Zinc from China and Silver from Mexico). The music will be performed by the world-renown Axiom Brass quintet (based in Chicago). Join Stanley Park Ecology Society online as we welcome a panel of experts to discuss local food forest initiatives! A food forest or forest garden is a mixed canopy planting of edible native plants. Many have been established by Coast Salish Nations and other Indigenous communities in so-called BC with their continued stewardship to the present day.

The panel will share their experiences with creating and/or managing food forests in different spaces and contexts of Metro Vancouver [ancestral and stolen territories of the qićəý(Katzie), qwa:ńλəń (Kwantlen), kwikwəλəm (Kwikwetlem), máthxwi (Matsqui), xwməθkwəyəm (Musqueam), qiqéyt (Qayqayt), se'mya'me (Semiahmoo), Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish), scəwaθən məsteyəxw (Tsawwassen) and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) First Nations].
